## Greenhouse Completed

What a wonderful, positive luxury the greenhouse has provided for the study of plants at Ballard! Last year at this time we were growing plants in window sills and several cold frames. This year, two classes of students have been consistently using the greenhouse on a daily basis, the Botany class and the Vocational Special Education students. Students are conducting experiments on different organic fertilizers on various vegetables, growing native plant species from cuttings and learning how to propagate from cuttings by growing Christmas cactus. At the beginning of February two more Horticulture classes will be using the greenhouse on a daily basis as well. In February, students will be

learning how to propagate roses as well as begin growing seedlings for the Interbay P-Patch and the Food Science classes.

Two seniors are building customized gardening benches for the greenhouse for their senior project. Three Biology teachers, as well as Mr. Quinn, English as a Second Language teacher, have reserved greenhouse space for the month of February for their students bringing the total number of students using the greenhouse by the end of February to nearly 500.

After the Biology and ESL students do their experiments, the 9th grade students will be doing their environmental plant projects in the spring bringing the total up to 800

## BHS Foundation: How It Came About

A group of alumni and former parents began planning the "last open house" before the high school was to be demolished in 1997. Our discussions were based more on the "past" rather than on the "future". The public debate had featured heated discussions from those who wanted to preserve the historic building versus the School District, parents, business community, alumni and actual students who favored the building of a new school that they had lobbied for throughout the 1980's and 1990's.

The open house committee was using phrases like "the last open house" and "experience the old walls before the school is demolished." Nowhere was the future of Ballard High School discussed in a positive manner as the group planned the open house. Then one night in the winter of 1997, before a School Board meeting at the school, the Student Body President (all of 17 years old) said "...Ballard High School is about a student body, it's

not about a building." In the spirit of that statement this ad hoc organizing committee adjusted its thinking from being "the last" to using the occasion of this open house as a vehicle for the "the beginning" to support the future of the Ballard High School Student Body. To achieve this goal the Ballard High School Foundation idea was born and grew from a seed of hope to a reality in very few months.

In this edition of your *Foundation's Talisman*, we want to list the accomplishments of your Foundation through the generosity of thousands of donors over these past eight years. Much has been accomplished to provide the tools for the students, faculty and the administration that makes Ballard High the excellent school it is and demonstrates the kind of school it continues to strive to be.

With the completion of the greenhouse funding drive, over \$1,400,000 has been privately and collectively raised and spent on

# Greenhouse Efforts Pay Off

2005 saw the culmination of over seven years of effort to have a greenhouse built for Ballard High School. Originally, it was to be included with the new building, but the project was dropped when construction bids to build the new high school were not sufficient to include the greenhouse. The unwavering commitment from the BHS Foundation, school faculty, staff, administration paid off and they saw their hopes and dreams realized when the beautiful new greenhouse was completed this summer.

The greenhouse is located on the west side of the building and is seen from 15th Avenue NW. It is connected to the school by doors and a hallway into the school's eight classroom science wing. The greenhouse has been used for classes since the opening of school in 2005.

After the final design, permits and approvals were obtained, a remarkable \$250,000 was raised by the Foundation in just five months. The goal is to have over 1,000 students a year receive

science credits for classes taken in the new greenhouse. This effort shows the solid support the Ballard community gives to education. Working together we accomplished outstanding results.

# Technology is the Future and The Future is Now

Principal Phil Brockman '76 and BHS Tech Specialist John Keithly have requested that the BHS Foundation support the purchase of two Mobile Laptop Computer Carts. This they feel, will increase computer accessibility at Ballard High School. According to Mr. Brockman; "From the day I walked into this building, teachers have been asking for more computer access." Mr. Keithly states, "There are 450 computers for the 1660 students at Ballard. Approximately 350 are set up in large (up to 30) and small (5-10) computer labs. They are located in the following areas of the school campus: The John Stanford Library, Graphics, Journalism, Video Production, Career Counseling, Special Ed, Science, Language Arts, Business and Social Studies departments. The remaining 100 computers are found either alone or in pairs in the remaining classrooms. It's not enough for the students to keep the edge on technology."

Each Mobile Laptop Lab Cart would have 20 wireless laptop

computers, a printer, a document camera and a projector. Teachers would be able to check them out and temporarily convert any classroom into a computer classroom. The teachers would be able to work one-on-one with the students through this lab.

Mr. Keithly and Marianne Baker '70, the BHS Foundation's Committee Chair, have done their homework to find the best technology for the best price. They have procured estimates and gathered information in an effort to make the best purchase in this ever changing world of technology. In addition, they have researched and visited other schools that have made similar purchases. The cost estimates are \$50,000.

Academic excellence is the number one goal at Ballard and additional computers and innovative programs will ensure this success. As all of you know, the students must keep up with the rapidly changing technology, so please use the enclosed envelope to send your contribution to fund the Mobile Computer Labs.

# It Was a Very Good Year Foundation Projects 2004-2005

As the words to the song go, "It was a very good year...". This is especially true of the amazing results the sixty-nine members of the BHS Foundation Board of Directors achieved during the past year on behalf of our favorite high school and for most of us, our alma mater. The Fifth Annual John Boitano Golf Classic netted more than \$50,000 that has been disbursed to 21 athletic programs at the school. This event was chaired by Art Olsen "63 of Olsen Furniture in Ballard.

For the first time, the BHS Foundation undertook a major capital fundraising project. The challenge was to raise money for a greenhouse that was eliminated from the plans for the new school at the time of construction due to budget constraints. More than \$250,000 was raised in a short six-month capital campaign. Many thanks are due to Jim Crim '52, Engineer and Dick Scheumann '52, Engineer & General Contractor who oversaw the greenhouse construction by Tom Neilson '56 of Evergreen House, Inc. All three of these people and their families were also major donors to the project. We cannot thank our

900- plus donors enough for their generosity in getting the greenhouse built. Principal Phil Brockman '76 estimates that over 1000 students will use the greenhouse each school year. The project was completed this past summer and a dedication ceremony was held on October 1<sup>st</sup>. Dick Lee '61 served as Chair and MC at this event which featured Raj Mahas, Superintendent of Seattle Public Schools, as the guest speaker.

This year our annual meeting was held at Mark Mitchell's (class of '53) Red Crane Café Club Hollywood on October 11th. Each year awards are given to individuals and businesses who make exceptional contributions to the BHS Foundation. This is called the Captain William R. Ballard Award. Recipients this year were Ed Lagerquist '56, Paul Clark '83, Gary Hirst '55, Mark Mitchell '53, Joanne Orsucci '83, Paul Plumis, parent, Wally Kerwin of Swanson's Nursery and Greenhouse, and Dick Lilly, Seattle School Board.

Looking ahead in year 2006, we hope to furnish the greenhouse, raise money for a portable computer cart for the school, increase the Foundation's

## From the Principal's Office

Wow! The commitment, dedication, and drive the Ballard High School Foundation demonstrated this past year has been incredible. The dream of the new Greenhouse has been realized because of your devotion to our students. On behalf of Ballard High School students and staff, thank you very much, to all of you that contributed to the construction of the Ballard High School Greenhouse!

Our school has grown to have more than 1660 students this year and we continue to add classes and programs to support our students. This year we are implementing a 9<sup>th</sup> grade academy to help with the transition to high school. The purpose of the academy is for teachers to get to know students better so that we reduce failure rates, increase academic achievement, and to better prepare students for the Washington Assessment of Student Learning (WASL) in their sophomore year. A high stakes test that students must pass to graduate.

Because of the number of students that choose to go Ballard High School, we have many teachers sharing classrooms and computer labs. The demand for technology and access to existing computer labs have become an issue. The solution is to have mobile computer labs. The advantage to having mobile labs is to give computer access to an additional 200 - 300 students per day. The cost for these labs will be about \$50,000. We plan to use these labs in the 9<sup>th</sup> grade academy to better prepare students for the WASL. In addition, the labs will be used by students across disciplines for research papers, presentations, and culminating projects.

Ballard High School students are great kids that deserve every possible resource that we can provide so that they are prepared for a successful life after high school. We want them to be self directed learners and good citizens. Thank you for supporting our students and the Flagship of Seattle High Schools.

## Our Mission Statement

To support the students, faculty and administration of Ballard High School by enriching the school educational programs and activities; to honor the school’s past to instill in today’s students a sense of belonging and tradition while inspiring them toward self worth, achievement and community service...so Ballard High School will be a world class learning center for the benefit of the Seattle community.

## Our Report Card

### First Eight Year–BHS Foundation Accomplishments

#### I – Education/Curriculum Programs

##### *Maritime Academy*

Provided the school with \$40,000 over the first three years as seed monies to establish this directed line of study and continues to provide materials, supplies and field trip underwriting for programs.

##### *Biotechnology*

Purchased high-powered microscopes and over \$35,000 worth of supplies and equipment while providing a non-profit conduit for corporate support.

##### *John Stanford Library*

Named to honor the late School District Superintendent, John Stanford, the Foundation marshaled a major campaign in 2003–04 raising over \$100,000, creating a library fund to purchase 1000’s of reference and literature books benefiting the wide diversity of studies available to our students at Ballard.

##### *Music Department*

Purchased new band uniforms when the student body moved into the new building. Bought much needed musical instruments for band and orchestra (none had been purchased since the early 1960’s), provided new guitars for a new special start-up guitar class, funded two M.I.D.I. labs for music students to compose music electronically. Purchased new sheet music for orchestra, band and choir and provided seed money to produce their recorded CDs... the Foundation sponsored, staged and promoted two *The Brothers Four Concerts* in 2002 & 2003 with proceeds benefiting other music needs of the department.

##### *Street Law Program*

Provided the seed money for the first three years to establish this academic elective course in the Social Studies Department while providing books and professional program assistance.

##### *Art Department*

Funded an “artist-in-residence” program that produced the students’ tiled wall on the Art Department corridor; purchased both a printing press and a ceramic kiln and supplies to enhance the department’s programs.

##### *Visual Art Collection*

The Foundation has funded, coordinated, and received gifts of works of art resulting in a collection of art (sculptures and paintings) professionally mounted throughout public space of the school. It serves as a learning tool for the art classes and art appreciation for the entire student body and faculty. Visiting alumni and community members also enjoys this public art. The art is juried and must meet one of the following criteria points: it must be by professional artists who have attended BHS; created by recognized artists who have created art and/or have studios are in Ballard; the subject matter relates to place or activities in the Ballard area and its history; or it is significant to the diverse population of the students and faculty.

Most of the artist represented in this collection were students of Oree Noble, art teacher at Ballard High School for 30 years from the 1930’s through the 1950’s. In 2006, a Foundation goal is to establish a docent program for student classes, alumni reunions, and for interested community groups. The Art Committee has begun work on a catalog of the art and artists in the collection.

##### *Foreign Language Department*

Provided funding for class support for the visitation of exchange students from Japan.

##### *Academy of Finance*

Grants from the Foundation to support students in the regional and national DECA competitions.

##### *Technology*

The new school building was established as a model technological equipped facility. The Foundation directed funds for purchase of computers and with cooperation of businesses, co-funded the necessary infrastructure for the system. Funds were provided for an innovative program using palm pilots to enhance academic achievement for an entering freshman class. Supported the tech students through their Computers for the World program where students refurbish donated computers and deliver them to third world countries and train students to use them..

##### *Video Production Program*

Provided funding for cameras, film, production needs and other supplies in support of this outstanding student program that consistently wins awards and recognition locally and nationally.

##### *“Shingle” Staff*

Provided digital photographic capabilities to produce the student’s Annual.

##### *Tutoring Program*

Funded a tutoring program for students including books and software for instructor reference. This is high priority of our school’s agenda for academic excellence.

##### *Physics Teacher Support*

The Foundation served as a conduit of funding to BHS Physics teacher from a former student (honoring his teacher) for special classroom teaching needs.

##### *Journalism Class*

Financial support of the student newspaper, *The Talisman*, for the production needs when the school’s activity budget was cut.

##### *Drama Department*

The Foundation’s support to the Drama Department include the purchase of costumes, theatrical supplies (from make-up to scene construction), and the funding of artists-in-residence. Co-sponsored an auction with Rotary Club of Ballard to benefit the schools performing arts with emphasis on drama. In 2000, the Foundation, the faculty and students petitioned the School Board to name the 490-seat theater in honor of the former drama teacher, Earl Kelly, as the Earl Kelly Performing Arts Center. Mr. Kelly was a much heralded drama teacher at Ballard for over 20 years who instilled in his students a great degree of self respect, internal growth and achievement to stay in

school, graduate and continue further through college or other professional arenas.

##### *Physical Education*

Provided funds specifically directed by an alumnus to outfit a physical fitness and strengthening room with professional equipment and trainer available to the entire student body – not just the athletic team members as is the norm in other schools when such a facility is available. The room is named in memory of Coach Henry Bendele, head football and basketball coach at Ballard from the 1940’s through the 1960’s and at that time regarded as the “winningest” football coach in the state.

##### *Greenhouse*

Ballard High School Foundation’s latest and longest project is the \$250,000 funding and construction of the greenhouse. Both the drive and the construction were accomplished from January–June 2005. This facility will benefit a wide range of science and science related classes i.e. Biology, Botany, Horticulture, Biotechnology, Maritime Academy, AP Biology, Food Science Program and English as a Second Language Science Class. Over two-thirds of a 1660 member student body will benefit from this facility in any one year. 900 donations ranging from one dollar to gifts of \$45,000.00 collectively made this greenhouse a reality this fall for the students. (see donor list on page 2.)

##### *Endowment Fund*

In 2000 the Foundation established the Endowment Fund held in safe keeping at the Seattle Foundation. This Endowment Fund resulted from donations, wills, planned giving and memorials by Ballard alumni, friends of Ballard alumni and by community friends of Ballard High School. The annual interest generated by this trust will be distributed by your Foundation toward classroom needs to further the goal of academic excellence at Ballard High School. The principal of the fund is not spent. Our ultimate goal is to have a principal of \$5,000,000. To learn more about the Endowment Fund, call our hotline 206-521-3208.

#### II – Faculty and Administration

##### *Faculty Spirit*

The Foundation provided identification lanyards to all faculty and staff to be worn over the neck with Ballard Beavers printed in red and black.

##### *Video Screen and Sound System*

Purchased large video screen and sound system for the library for meetings that are used by teachers, including the librarian, for special class instruction. An additional mobile system purchased by the Foundation is available for special programs, meetings and events throughout the public spaces of the school for gatherings of students, community, alumni, and parents.

##### *Administration Support*

Purchased special office equipment and supplies helpful to support staff to enhance their ability to accomplish the expectations of the administration, the faculty, parents and the community.

##### *Sister City Program*

The Foundation financially supported the needs of the BHS to initiate a sister city school relationship in Sweden.

##### *Principals’ Wall*

The Foundation funds and maintains the “Wall of Principals” in the main administrative office which includes the framed photographic portraits of all 13 principals who have headed up this school throughout its 104 year history.

#### III. School Spirit

##### *Senior Alley Banners*

At the request of the 2003 Senior Class, the Foundation purchased and installed red and black “Ballard Beaver Spirit” banners in the present school seniors locker hallway.

##### *The Main Gym Floor*

The Foundation financed the professional painting of the main gymnasium with the school’s red and black colors for team sports and painting lines for various sports for the Physical Education Department that had been overlooked in the original construction plans.

# Eight Years of Success (Continued)

## **King-Co League Banners/Main Gym**

The main gymnasium is the major assembling hall for the student body and other major school related activities involving community support. The gym also serves as the main court for girls and boys basketball, gymnastics, volleyball and wrestling events. The Foundation funded the colorful banners of all the King-Co League Schools, Ballard's athletic league, as well as painting the floor and other spirit memorabilia in red and black, making this space the center of the school's "Ballard Beaver Spirit." At the same time, the Foundation, faculty, students and parents petitioned the School Board to name this facility in honor of Dick Lee '61, alumnus and recognized basketball player. He showed his support to the school in 1990 by co-founding with parents the annual Beaver Bash and continues to lend support to this annual event. He also organized and chaired the Foundation's major public events.

## **The Alumni Room**

The furnishing of the main floor Alumni Room directly across from the 65<sup>th</sup> Street main entrance was made possible by the Foundation through gifts of furniture and wall décor from alumni. The room is used by alumni, the Foundation, PTSA and the administration for small meetings. The room was named in 2004 to honor a successful Texas business man and alumnus, Victor Salvino '51 who has over these eight years been a generous donor to the Foundation in support of many of the Foundation's major programs for the school.

## **Captain William R. Ballard Awards**

These awards, with appropriate plaques, are presented to over 50 individuals and businesses who have given undo amounts of time and energy directly through the Foundation to benefit the school.

## **Beaver Trail Tiles**

One of the earliest and continuing projects of the Foundation was the setting up and continuing sale of engraved tiles on walkways leading into the school to raise money for the Foundation's ongoing support of the school and student body needs. By the time Ballard reopened on the present site all the tiles for the first Beaver Trail from the front door down to the sidewalk at NW 65<sup>th</sup> had been sold and installed. To date the Foundation has sold 3,434 installed tiles in several Trails and has 4,740 tiles yet to be paid and spoken for. Seeing the names of alums, students and parents with attached years, mottos or verses is an inspiration to all who read them while walking around the Ballard High School Campus.

## **Establishment of the Foundation's Millennium Club**

The very first effort of the Foundation in its first few months was the establishment of what was to be called the Foundation's Millennium Club. The premise was to get 100 alumni and Ballard businesses to give \$1,000 each to create the financial base for the Foundation and to establish it as a potential major player in the new Ballard High School success story. Launched in late 1996, in twelve months we had not only received 100 plus paid Millennium Club members but had received hundreds of other gifts of money at all levels of donations. The success of the Foundation donation drive has to be attributed to the endless energy of so many individuals willing to give long hours, open their address books and ask. With this initial funding the Foundation was on its way to helping the student body and the faculty and the alumni and the parents came to believe the "new Ballard" was possible.

## **Preserving Student Talismans 1918 – 2000**

82 years of tattered, fragile school newspapers, *The Talisman*, that were stored in cupboards in the Library undisturbed, were discovered by Foundation's History Committee. They needed to be preserved immediately so the Foundation engaged a firm to put them on CDROMS for safe keeping. The University of Washington archive department is putting them on microfilm and will keep a copy. The Foundation has these CD ROMS available for purchase through the Foundations website, bhsfoundation.com or phone, (206) 521-3208.

## **Ballard Night at the Mariners: 2001-2005**

The Foundation has sold approximately 1000 tickets each year to local businesses, alumni, students and their families. Proceeds go to recognized needs of the school and the 2005 proceeds were distributed to the greenhouse project.

## **IV. Traditions "we honor our traditions to inspire the future"**

### **Foundation Mailing List**

Neither the School District nor Ballard High School itself maintains a mailing list of those who attended, graduated from the school. From the Foundation's birth, the Board began to assemble a mailing list and now after eight years it has created a mailing list of alums, former parents, community friends, Ballard businesses and civic groups that numbers 21,000 plus. This list has been assembled through countless hours of volunteer efforts pouring over address books, reunion mailing lists, Golden Beavers, Foundation donors, Foundation event ticket buyers and sign in sheets at gatherings. ### **The Foundation Talisman**

Totally financed and produced by the Foundation to keep you informed about the school and especially about the Foundation's work on behalf of the Ballard High student body. It provides you with opportunities for you to participate through donations of time, money and/or in-kind services. This is the 10<sup>th</sup> edition of *The Foundation Talisman*. Many thanks to the talented and dedicated volunteer alumni who make it possible.

### **Wall of Recognition**

A "Wall of Recognition" was established in the schools main entrance hall to recognize distinguished alumni who have made a major contribution to his or her community, profession, society or country in their field of expertise. The nominee should be recognized as exceptional by their peers. Alumni are nominated to the Foundation and are voted upon by the Board of Directors and continually accept nominations. This award was stimulated by many comments from students in Ballard High's "dark days" of the 1970's and 1980's... "that nobody from Ballard becomes 'somebody.'" We feel this recognition program succeeds in both countering that feeling of several decades ago while showing pride in our alumni accomplishments.

### **Donor Wall**

The Foundation maintains a donor wall of all those individuals, foundations, businesses who have provided the financial resources to your Foundation in pursuit of its goals to enhance the educational experience of each Ballard student while instilling in them the pride of being a Ballard Beaver.

## **V. Boys and Girls Athletic Teams**

### **Uniform/Equipment**

In the early years of the Foundation, its Athletic Committee, raised and allocated funds, to purchase team uniforms and equipment. In some cases our teams had been using used Lincoln Lynx uniforms as there were no funds available in the late 1980's and early 1990's. Uniform and equipment funds now come mostly through fundraising events outlined later in this section.

### **Henry Bendele Strength Training Room**

Earlier described under "physical education" in Section I,

### **Ballard High School Golf Tournament at Fort Lewis: 1998, 1999**

Ballard's athletic department and the Foundation cosponsored this two year event at Fort Lewis with proceeds going to new equipment.

### **John Boitano Golf Classic: 2001, 2002, 2003, 2004, 2005**

Co-sponsored by the Foundation and the high school's Athletic Booster Club each summer to support purchase of uniforms and equipment for all the school's boys and girls athletic teams.

### **Master Golf Tournament Raffle: 2004, 2005**

The Foundation undertook two raffles with the prize being two tickets to the famous Masters Golf Tournament

in Augusta and included round-trip airfare. Proceeds benefited BHS athletics. This generous gift of the Master's tickets used for the raffle was from an alumnus.

### **Bebe Burns Annual Tennis Tournament: 2004**

Co-sponsored by the Foundation and the Ballard High Athletic Booster Club whose receipts benefit all sports at Ballard.

## **VI. Support of Ballard PTSA**

### **"Beaver Bash" Support**

In 1999 and 2000 the Foundation provided start up seed money to the PTSA for each of their auctions. Now the PTSA allocates money from the receipts of each auction for start up the next year. The Foundation encourages alumni to attend and asks them for donations each year to support the Bash.

### **"BASH Quilt"**

Annually bid on the right at the Bash to have one's name on the frame of this unique specially crafted 72"X60"quilt which now hangs permanently in the foyer leading to the Library. The Foundation allocated several thousand dollars to professionally design and construct the enclosed frame and paid for the installation.

## **VII. Celebration**

To date the Foundation has paid for, promoted and staged major events at and about Ballard High School for its students and its alumni and community.

### **All Class Reunion: Spring 1997**

A gigantic free open house and reception was staged, financed and promoted by the Foundation so alumni, neighbors and the broader community could walk through the old school that was built in 1916 before the doors closed in preparation for construction of the new school. Over 13,000 people attended this all afternoon event where the public launching of the Foundation took place.

### **Grand Opening New Facility: Fall 1999**

Again, choreographed, staged and financed by the Foundation who promoted it successfully as a major civic event not only for the Ballard Community, but the school district as a whole and the city. It was done in four segments, each in different locales of the campus beginning with an early special coffee reception for the members of the Golden Beavers and classrooms designated for each class year.

### **100<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of the School: Fall 2002**

In observance of the original Ballard High School, known originally as Central School, located on Tallman Avenue and Broadway (now Market Street) when Ballard was an independent city with its own school district. The observance was staged by the Foundation with help of the students, faculty and administration in the new building.

## **VIII. Community**

The Foundation is an active member of the Ballard Chamber of Commerce, member of the school's Building Leadership Team and maintains close relationships with the PTSA, the Student Body and the administration by having the heads of each as members of the Foundation's Board of Directors. The Foundation also maintains close relationships with the Alliance for Education and the Seattle Foundation which provide certain caretaking of our funds and with the School District's offices and in the case of the greenhouse project, the Districts Office of Construction. Without their help and cooperation this project would not have been a reality.

After a nationwide search and hours of screenings, two films by BHS producers were among the eight youth media productions selected for presentation! The honored films are the music video "The Drive Thru" and the documentary "TC4" (see production credits above).

*BHS Filmmakers go to Sundance!*

The Sundance Institute has chosen the BHS Video Production Program for a grant to attend the 2006 Sundance Film Festival. The educational package provides complimentary tickets, priority reservations, invitations to an informal gathering of festival filmmakers, and festival credentials for 12 of our advanced production students. The BHS program was selected from a pool of outstanding high school film and video programs across the country.

This is the most recent of several honors BHS filmmakers have won since last spring. Last June, eight works by advanced as well as intro video production students were Official Selections at the Lake2Sound Film Festival, an event that accepts work from college and high school students in the Puget Sound area. When the jury announced prizes, BHS filmmakers took 1st, 2nd, and 3rd Prize as well as two of four Honorable Mentions. Juror Gregory Wylie observed that "the work from Ballard High School was consistently as good - or better - than work from college programs." In July, three BHS productions were winners at the 29th Annual Young People's Film & Video Festival, a competitive festival accepting submissions from 5 northwest states. In September, two films by BHS producers were among the eight youth media productions selected for presentation at the 10th Annual 1 Reel Film Festival, a national showcase of short films hosted by Seattle's Bumbershoot. Classes in the BHS Video Production Program fulfill either the Fine Art or Occupational Education

requirement, and are open to students in every grade. Based on their portfolios, graduates of the program have gained admission and scholarship to some of the most competitive film schools in the world. They have also been invited to show their work and make presentations at the Seattle Art Museum and national conferences such as the Alliance for Community Media, the National Association of Media Arts and Culture, and the National Youth Media Access Project. The program has provided internships through The Youth Channel, 911 Media Arts Center, King County, SCAN, and The Northwest Film Forum, as well as a number of feature films shot in Seattle. A Professional Advisory Committee supports the program.

## Library Average Copyright Date Gets Younger

Ballard High School Librarian, Sue Weiss '63, has been busy purchasing new books for BHS students. Most of these new books are being purchased with funds raised by the BHS Foundation's Library Campaign several years ago. However, the need for new books continues and this year teachers have requested books for Advance Placement Tests, Business Education, and Washington and Seattle History. 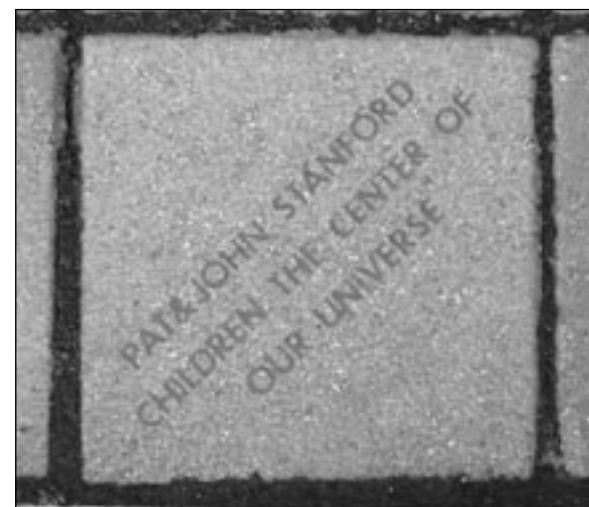
the students. A newsletter, *The Log*, is published twice a year.

## Ballard Maritime Academy Sails Into 2006

The Ballard Maritime Academy will begin this year's activities with their annual retreat to SailSandpoint on October 7<sup>th</sup>. It is a day of sailing, kayaking, knot-tying and survival suits. They take advantage of the boats available at SailSandpoint, a non-profit sailing program on the old Sandpoint Naval Station. The students get to sail all kinds of craft, paddle kayaks and canoes, and tour Lake Washington on the charter yacht *PS Adventures*. The retreat is a chance for the upper-classmen to welcome the new sophomores and for everyone to have a day together on the water

before winter sets in.

The sophomore students in the Maritime Academy will be taking a field trip to tour Port of Seattle sites on Tuesday, October 4<sup>th</sup>. The students will begin their tour at Shilshole Bay Marina to see what it takes to run a recreational marina of this size, as well as to see the scope of the new construction underway there. Then the class will head to Fisherman's Terminal where they will see the local fishing fleet and the facilities available to them there. After touring one of the container terminals, they will continue their tour at the port offices on Pier 69 where they will tour the commission's chambers and this unique converted

canning facility which houses most of the port's administrative offices. Their final stop will be Pier 66, Bell Harbor Marina and the Cruise Ship terminal. The students will have an opportunity to explore Odyssey, the Maritime Discovery Center, a hands-on facility that teaches about Seattle's maritime community. Following their tour, the students will have Rich Berkowitz, a candidate for port commissioner, talk to the class about the port and his reasons for running for one of the open commission seats.

Besides this, the sophomore class is planning to take a science/sailing cruise in Puget Sound as part of a

marine science project, the junior class is planning to restore one of the dories from the cod fishing schooner *Wawona*, as well as take a cruise aboard the classic schooner *Zodiac*, and the senior class is planning an overnight trip to the Vancouver Aquarium. The students are completing the project they began last year, an 18' wooden sea kayak, which they hope to have ready by the Maritime Festival in the spring. They will, of course, be fielding a survival suit team at this year's Fisherman's Fall Festival at Fishermen's Terminal on the 1<sup>st</sup> of October and hope to bring home the trophy.

## The Public Art Collection in the School

Ballard High School is one of only two public high schools in Seattle and environs to have an art collection gracing its walls and ours is a special and outstanding one. Started in 1999 with the opening of the new school, the collection now includes some forty+ works of art. Ten pieces are waiting to be installed when we find the necessary funds to make this happen. Our most recent installation is a handsome piece by T. Michael Gardiner hung east of the main lobby on the second floor. It's entitled 'Mars-i-pan' 2005. Michael is a well known Seattle artist who not only lives in Ballard but is the father of a Ballard senior!

We are also pleased to announce that Ballard High School and the Foundation, was the recipient of a gift of sculpture from the Seattle Public Library. When the Ballard branch moved into its new building, BHS was the lucky recipients of a sculpture that was an important and significant part of the old library building. The sculpture by Archie Graber is titled the "Tree of Knowledge" and was commissioned by the Library Board of

Trustees in 1963. You may remember seeing this important piece over the main desk of the old Ballard Branch library. It was one of the few pieces of art commissioned by any public body at that time. Both as a work of art that certainly meets our educational and art purposes and as an important historic piece, the sculpture will be a wonderful addition to our collection. Appropriately, it will be installed outside the library on the second floor.

Philip McCracken, well known sculptor living on Guemes Island, has also recently given us a work by Willard Parker which will be hung during the next few months. The next time you're in the building you may want to look for work by some of your former classmates. Works selected for the collection must either be by alumni who have become professional, exhibiting artists or by professional artists who have lived and/or worked in Ballard. Or the pieces must reflect the culture and community of Ballard in its contents. The committee has observed the highest aesthetic standards.

Members of the blue ribbon art committee that has assembled the collection are all alumni with impressive credentials in the art world.
